

The Volcano Theatre and the St. George Hotel are pleased to welcome Mary Chase's Harvey to the outdoor amphitheatre! Harvey has been an American favorite since it was first brought to Broadway in 1944, running for four years (1,775 performances!) and winning the Pulitzer Prize for drama. It has continually been revived around the globe since that time and was adapted to film in 1950 starring Hollywood legend Jimmy Stewart. It became one of his most memorable and best-loved films.

The story follows Elwood P. Dowd, a goodnatured, mild-mannered eccentric who is known in all of the cafeterias and saloons in his small town. He is polite and cheerful and always friendly toward any



strangers he might encounter. He has just one little problematic character trait: his best friend Harvey is an invisible six-foot-tall rabbit! (Yes, RABBIT!). Where ever Elwood goes, he brings an extra hat and coat for Harvey. He buys theater and railroad tickets in twos so that he and Harvey can go everywhere together. Being an embarrassment to his social-climbing relations, his sister and niece try to have Elwood committed to the local sanitarium, where confusion reigns supreme as to who is more dangerous to society: the easy-going dreamer with a vivid imagination or the people who want him to conform to THEIR accepted version of reality.
