Our summer offering is a crazy comedy like nothing you've seen on the amphitheatre stage! Are you ready to laugh out loud? Do hairy men spewing prose and wielding swords make you swoon? Oh baby, "BEOWULF (and the Bard)" is EXACTLY what you need!

Let's begin at the beginning with a quick history lesson: Beowulf is the first action hero ever and his story is as old as the ages (literally!), written in England sometime between the 9th and 11th centuries by an anonymous author, now referred to as the "Beowulf Poet" and it consisted of 3,182 lines of poetry (oh MY!). This epic poem, now considered one of the most important in Anglo-Saxon literature was taught in school (and if you are of a certain age, you may already know this from your old English lit class!) but for centuries it was all but forgotten. Finally in 1936, Oxford scholar J.R.R. Tolkein (who later wrote The Hobbit-a work HEAVILY influenced by Beowulf) published a groundbreaking paper "Beowulf: The Monsters and the Critics" and at that point the original poem gained recognition as a serious work of art!

But, all seriousness aside, "Beowulf (and the Bard)" as written by Christopher R. Barlett and S. Vidas Barzdukas, is a very cheeky take on a sad-sack Beowulf (played by Noah Bunting) and his bestie, The Bard (Jim Estes), who is a storyteller and self-described writer of prose, who also happens to be suffering a major case of writer's block! The pair have been banned from their homeland and told not to return until Beowulf performs a feat of heroism, which may be difficult, since he is a pacifist at heart! Nuts! (more on that later!) . . .

So, the Bard, entertaining the patrons of the local Mead Hall, tells the story of Beowulf: strong, brave and able to fight an Ogre (or is it OgreSSS!?) and save King Hrothgar's (Brad Barnard) village and enable the Village Dandy, Unferth (James Dove) to continue to build his tennis courts! (Have you played? Fabulous game!). The King is joined by his daughter, Gunborg (Jade Meza), a WARRIOR Princess, Aeschere (newcomer Todd Bertwell) his trusted advisor, a trio of Patrons (Jim Caudle, Ian Davidson and Joel Lesch) who play double duty as Villagers, and there may even be an actual ogre (Robert Schell) or two, but SHHH, we're not telling!

We have a feeling this show will be a crowd favorite and tickets may sell quickly, so we recommend you get your tickets soon!

We are a 501(C)3 not-for-profit theatrical corporation run ENTIRELY by volunteers! For almost 50 years! We love what we do - putting on fabulous award-winning theatrical productions for our community - and we're pretty darn good at it, if we do say so ourselves. And we do this while also preserving the historic character of our venues: the Cobblestone Theatre, originally built as a cigar emporium in 1855 and the Amphitheatre, the façade of which was a saloon and a law school.

The proceeds from ticket sales fund future productions, paying for utilities, taxes and general maintenance of our theatre venues. But we have plans for significant improvements that will affect the quality of our performances and "set the stage" for the future.

Our current "wish list" for big ticket projects will make everyone's Volcano Theatre experience much better - for our patrons, actors and volunteers. If you are in ANY POSITION to "adopt a project", make a general donation, or if you can donate your time, materials and/or talents, PLEASE HELP!

Our current "wish list" includes:

- Re-wiring all the electrical in the Cobblestone Theatre! As we upgrade sound and lighting systems, we find that the current (very old) wiring needs complete replacement. Estimate: \$20,000
- Adding two new 10' x 10' barn-style sheds for storage of props and costumes on a base rock pad. Estimate: \$3,000-\$5,000 EACH
- Extending the light booth in the Amphitheatre to allow more effective placement of light and sound equipment. Estimate: \$3,000-\$5,000
- Updating HVAC system in the Cobblestone Theatre to a more efficient system for the comfort of our patrons and actors. Estimate: \$15,000 or more!
